DIY Kaleidoscope Instrutcions

NOTE: This craft can be a little messy, but that is OKAY

It's what makes it memorable and fun 🥳

Remember, you can take as long as you need to complete.

Supplies:

- Aprons
- Paint
- Paint brushes
- Cups filled with water
- Paper towels
- Craft tubes
- Paper Plate
- Pre-assembled mirrored paper, taped into a triangle
- Pre-cut bendy straw
- Tape
- Pre-cut and hole-punches paper circle
- Stickers and coloring supplies
- Pencil or Pen

Instructions:

1. Put on the aprons and pass out the craft tubes on a paper plate.
2. Let the kids paint the outside of their craft tube. Take a break to let it dry.
3. Help the kids insert their mirrored triangles into their tube. It should wedge in quite nicely and not fall out.
4. Help the kids tape the straw to the outside of their craft tube with the bendy part of the straw just barely hanging over the edge. (See sample)
5. Allow the kids to decorate their pre-cut and punched paper circle with stickers and coloring supplies. IMPORTANT, make sure the hole is not covered.
6. Use the pencil or pen to widen the hole just enough so that the circle can be slipped onto the straw with the bendy part of the straw holding the paper circle in place.
7. Look though the craft tube and turn the decorate paper cut out to enjoy the kaleidoscope!
8. Feel free to decorate more paper circles as time allows.
